1. background information on the length of the studio project (weeks/semesters) and the number of students involved in the submission.
2. A letter of support from your University that specifies your project has been nominated (even an email would be fine).
3. Copy of the design brief and other criteria as officially issued by the university.
4. Maximum 300-word executive summary design statement.
5. A report that includes research documentation relevant to the project and/or evidence of the design process.
6. Design drawings and model and/or photographs.
7. Copyright (Consent [Forms A & B](#)).

All questions must be answered, unless marked optional.

The NSW Graduate & Student Awards program was established in 2010 with the aim of promoting the skills of architecture students in NSW, coinciding with the introduction of the Bachelor of Architecture and Master of Architecture degrees.

In 2018, the Student Architecture Awards will include the following changes from previous years:

- for the NSW Graduate Medal and NSW Undergraduate Medal each university can now nominate respectively up to five undergraduate projects and five graduate projects (previously they could nominate only up to three).
- for the NSW Architectural Communication Award and the NSW Architectural Technologies Award all nominated projects (both undergraduate and graduate) will be considered (previously only graduate projects were judged).
- Winners will be announced in early March at the 2018 Student Architecture Awards Night. All nominees for the Awards are required to submit a photograph of their project.
